From the Pastor:

As I have been thinking about my Lutherland trip this summer to Scotland, Ireland, England and Germany I wondered if I would find any of my relatives over there. Certainly there should be some relatives from my grandfather's side of the family in Germany. If we wandered into Poland I could find my grandmother's people. We would have to go to Wales to get to my maternal grandfather's people, but we aren't going close to Norway for my maternal grandmother's relatives. I have never located the Native American side of the family.

With all of these different nationalities in my background, you really couldn't tell an ethnic joke without offending me! I guess the positive spin would be to say that I have hybrid vigor with all this variety of ethnicities. A more pejorative interpretation would be to say that I am just a mutt!

However you want to look at it there is an interesting mix of genetics at play here. Most folks are interested in knowing who they are genetically and where they came from. An example of that is that children who are adopted most often still want to know who their biological parents are. No matter how loving and wonderful their adoptive parents are, there is still that part of them that wants to know who they are genetically and where they came from and what their parents looked like.

So, genetics plays a major role in who we are as persons. However, there is another aspect to our personhood and that is the environment in which we grow up. The family in which we are raised has a huge influence in what kind of person we ultimately become. Certainly in my work in chemical dependency I have seen both of these factors come into play. Diseases tend to run in families and in ethnic groups. Children of addicted parents are 4 times more likely to become addicts themselves if they do any amount of drug usage. But children who came from non-addicted parents were much more likely to become addicts if they were adopted and/or raised by addicted parents.

So both nature and nurture combine to make us who we are. In thinking about ourselves as Christians we have to remember who we are as well. We confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean, but fortunately, we are nurtured by the Lord, since we have been adopted by Him in our baptisms. Sometimes people will say about us that we are just like our parents. I hope that people can say that about us in being children of God too. I wouldn't mind at all if people would say, "You act just like Jesus". I wouldn't be offended at all.

SPRING MARKET ELWOOD


